

Childhood Vaccines

Recommended Schedule for Immunizations

This list shows age ranges for shots. Ask your healthcare provider when your child should return for vaccines.

Birth	Hep B
2 months	DTaP, Hib, Polio, PCV, Rotavirus, Hep B
4 months	DTaP, Hib, Polio, PCV, Rotavirus, (Hep B if no birth dose)
6 months	DTaP, Hib, PCV, Rotavirus
6 - 18 months	Polio, Hep B
12 - 18 months	DTaP, Hib, PCV, MMR, Varicella, Hep A (2 doses)
4 - 6 years	DTaP, Polio, MMR, Varicella

Vaccination against influenza is recommended for all children age 6 through 59 months. For more information, contact your healthcare provider.

- ◆ HPV
- ◆ Hep A
- ◆ Hep B
- ◆ MMR
- ◆ Varicella
- ◆ TdaP
- ◆ Meningococcal
- ◆ Influenza



Back-to-School Shots

Depending on your child's grade, he or she may need the following immunizations:

- DTaP, Td, or TdaP
- IPV
- MMR
- Hepatitis B
- Varicella

**Vaccines Recommended
For Adults**

- Influenza
- Pneumonia
- Td or TdaP (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis/whooping cough)
- HPV (human papillomavirus)
- Shingles
- As an adult you may also need protection against MMR (measles, mumps, rubella), Varicella (chickenpox), Hepatitis B and Hepatitis A.
